2026 Roundtable in International Business Law at Brooklyn Law School

Dennis J. Block Center for the Study of International Business Law

On Friday, October 9, 2026, the Dennis J. Block Center for the Study of International Business Law will sponsor a Scholars' Roundtable at Brooklyn Law School. We invite scholars writing in fields related to international business, economic, and financial law to submit proposals to present works in progress for an intensive day of discussion with other scholars in the field. Participants must attend the full Roundtable in person, and they are expected to read all papers in advance and offer commentary on each presentation. Participants who come from outside the New York City area will receive reimbursement of eligible and documented travel expenses up to \$500 from Brooklyn Law School.

Requirements for Submission

- Applicants must hold a full-time position (including visitor/fellowship) at a law school or university. Scholars from outside the U.S. are encouraged to apply.
- Scholars who anticipate holding a full-time faculty appointment in 2026-2027 are welcome to apply.
- Applicants should submit an abstract of no more than 500 words. All papers presented must be unpublished at the time of the Roundtable. Papers that have been accepted for publication but are not yet in print are welcome.
- Papers may relate to any area of international business law. This is construed broadly to include all aspects of international economic law (trade, investment, tax, and finance), transnational business regulation, cross-border transactions, law relating to multinational business enterprises and securities, and international business disputes.
